## Rally Obedience

Rally involves you and your dog working as a team to navigate a course with numbered signs indicating different exercises to perform; think of it as a sort of 'obedience exercise obstacle course' including simple exercises.

Rally (or 'Rally O' as it's known in the USA) is a canine activity derived from the heelwork elements of competitive obedience. However it differs from obedience, primarily in that competitors and dogs attempt a preset course with signs placed at up to 18 stations along the course, requiring them to perform one of around 80 different preset exercises. The selection of exercises and design of the course is at the judge's discretion. Each individual round is performed at a brisk pace and takes around three minutes.

Rally is fun – no matter what experience level you or your dog have, it's easy to get involved, start training and then, competing. Your dog does not have to be pedigree dog to take part, however it must be registered with The Kennel Club on either the Breed Register or the Activity Register.
